13 Do not **present** your members to sin as instruments for unrighteousness,

but **present** yourselves to God as those who have been brought from death to life, and **present** your members to God as instruments for righteousness.

20 For when you were slaves of sin, you were free in regard to righteousness.

21 But **what fruit** were you getting at that time from the things of which you are now ashamed? For the end of those things is **death.**

"wages"/ law VERSUS **"free gift" / grace**

Romans 6:20-23

22 But now that you have been set free from sin and have become slaves of God, **the fruit you get leads to sanctification and its end, eternal life.**

23 For the **wages** of sin is **death**, but the **free gift** of God is **eternal life** in Christ Jesus our Lord.

15 What then? Are we to sin because we are not under law but under grace? By no means!

Romans 6:15-19

16 Do you not know that if you **present** yourselves to anyone as **obedient slaves**, you are **slaves** of the one whom you obey,

either of sin, which leads to death, or of **obedience**, which leads to righteousness?

17 But thanks be to God, that you who were once **slaves** of sin have become **obedient** from the heart to the standard of teaching to which you were committed,

18 and, having been set free from sin, have become **slaves** of righteousness.

19 I am speaking in human terms, because of your natural limitations.

For just as you once **presented** your members as **slaves** to impurity and to lawlessness leading to more lawlessness,

so now **present** your members as **slaves** to righteousness leading to sanctification.
