- He [God] had the absolute right to condemn or to save as He divinely saw fit. God's
 sovereignty and His grace not only are compatible but are inseparable. Because all
 men are sinful and deserve God's condemnation, no person is wronged or treated
 unjustly if God chooses to condemn him. That is justice. His mercy toward any
 person is purely by His grace.
- Continuing simply to declare God's truth, rather than fruitlessly trying to explain the logic of what is beyond human comprehension, Paul goes on to say, "So then it does not depend on the man who wills or the man who runs, but on God who has mercy." It is not man's choice or pursuit but God who initiates mercy for the sinner. Salvation is never initiated by human choice or merited by zealous human effort. It always begins in God's sovereign, gracious, and eternal will.
- He [Paul] does not resort to rational argument or to philosophical apologetics but bases his assertion directly on God's own Word.
- Self-centered man rebels at such a notion, and even many Christians vainly try to
 explain away the clear truth that God is God and that, by definition, whatever He
 does can be nothing but just and righteousness. He needs no justification for
 anything He does—including calling some men to salvation and not calling others.
 He has always acted thus.
- Unconditionally, and completely apart from any consideration of human merit, God elects those who will become His heirs of promise.
- While the major theme of chapters 9–11 is God's dealing with His elect nation, the
 underlying theme, especially of chapter 9, is God's sovereignty in doing so. It
 demands more than a superficial understanding. And yet, when the deepest
 meaning and implications of this passage are carefully considered, especially its
 unambiguous declaration of God's absolute and unrestricted sovereign power, even
 the most devoted believer is left with some profound mysteries.
