- ► Having offered our lives as living sacrifices, we must now individually evaluate our lives before God as we prepare for service.
- (1) I must evaluate the life of the "new" me, 12:3.
 - · We are not to think beyond ourselves.
 - We are to approach this very thoughtfully with all humility and seriousness.
 - We are to allow God to "think us past ourselves" according to the faith he has given.
 - Our "measure" is faith—believing God.
- (2) I must evaluate where the "new" me fits in the context of the Church, 12:4-5.
 - We are one body with many members.
 - We have differing gifts and differing functions.
 - We are unique in that we are one body in Christ. (Not just a group of people who have developed camaraderie and formed an organization.)
 - We are musketeers. One for all and all for one. In it together.
- (3) I must evaluate and exhort the "new" me in view of God's gifting, 12:6-8.

The "Skinny" on Spiritual Gifts in Romans 12 ...

Everyone has a gift.

The gift is given by God by grace.

The gifts differ.

The gifts are to be used.

The use of the gifts is directed by faith.

Note the Progression ...

Bow before God → Now Hear God → Renewed Mind → Changed Life → Know the Will of God by Real World Testing → Ready to See Where the "New" Me Fits in God's Plan.

Seeing the real you ...


My Plans!

- (Romans 12:3 ESV) For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you
