- Music in hymnal or music projected on screen
- Reading someone else's prayers as our prayer
- **Hair length** (legalistic application, e. g. hair cannot touch ears or shirt collar)
- Bible translation (KJV only for instance)
- Dancing
- Movie attendance
- Television
- Eat at restaurant that serves alcohol
- Buy groceries at stores that sell alcohol
- Drinking a **beer** or a glass of **wine**





- (14:1) "disputable matters" (NIV), "opinions" (NASB, ESV), "doubtful things" (NKJV), "scruples" (AMP), "doubtful disputations" (KJV).
- · Very important.

- Spiritual considerations, but not moral, ethical or doctrinal concerns.
- Neither right nor wrong.
- Very often determined by our spiritual upbringing.
- Almost always brought to the forefront by our culture, sub-culture.
- Not to be quarreled over.
- Not a matter of sin until a person "upgrades" a conviction to doctrine or morality.
